Women

Men's 1st XI

After falling short by a wicket in the final over against Malvern in round 1, the 1sts have gone undefeated and sit 3 points clear on top of the ladder ahead of bayside rivals Brighton in second.

The team's success has come off the back of strong team bowling performances, and incredible start to the season from **LJ Edwards**, who needs just 45 runs to break the men's 1st XI season aggregate record, with 7 games to play! Not only is LJ averaging 119 with the bat, his 593 runs have come off just 402 balls, a strike rate of 148, and two of his hundreds have come against last year's premiers in Caulfield and Preston. Young Englishman **Will Tripcony** has also impressed with 191 runs and seems close to scoring a big one after many starts. The bowling trio of quicks **Jacob Kerr** and **Jack Phillips**, and English orthodox **Fahad Sabir** sit 2nd, 3rd and 4th in the league wicket tallies respectively and have formed a dynamic and threatening bowling group. Jacob (pictured above) is having a breakout season that has included career best figures of 7-27 against Plenty Valley. As scorer Ray Street frequently says, onwards and upwards.

The seconds have had a somewhat frustrating first half of the season due to wash outs against Kew and Strathmore, but have set up their season with 5 strong wins and sit in 2nd place. Men's 3rd XII

The men's 3rds have recorded an incredible 20 wins in a row! The streak, which started in round 4, November 2024, includes last year's premiership victory and a run of 8 straight wins to start season 2025/26 in the step up to division 1. Led by captains Max Nethercott and Tom Ashman, the 3rds sit 13 points clear on top of the ladder on 49 points. It's been an even contribution across the board, with 5 players scoring 100+ runs and 6 players taking 7+ wickets. Stand out performances with the bat include **Jensen Kelsey**'s 101 against Oakleigh in round 3, **Max Nethercott**'s 91 in the T20 round & **Raj Kuver**'s 86 against Malvern in Rd 2. Talented youngster (under 15) **Krish Talwar** scored his first 50 for the 3s in the T20 round and has made a number of solid contributions so far with the bat this season. With the ball, **Hayagreev Bashyam** took 6-18 off 9 against Caulfield, **Venkat Vijay** starred with 4-12 off 9 against Croydon, **Henry Bennett** ripped through Malvern with 4-17 off 7.2, **Sean Kingston** tore apart Oakleigh with 4-23 off 7, and **Raj Kuver** did Raj Kuver things with 4-15 off 6 against Balwyn.




